The applicant made minor alignment changes that were outside of the originally evaluated area of potential effects, which have been evaluated by EPA.

On May 3, 2021, EPA provided the updated project scope to the Florida State Clearinghouse via email for evaluation under the National Historic Preservation Act and the Coastal Zone Management Act. On May 12, 2021, the Clearinghouse responded that they still do not select the project for review and that the action may proceed, which is consistent with the initial consultation conducted in November 2019.

On May 3, 2021, EPA provided the updated project scope to U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service via email. On May 4, 2021, the USFWS responded via email stating that the revised scope falls within the effects previously analyzed; therefore, the standing consultation is still valid. The USFWS concurs that the proposed Project is not likely to adversely affect any federally listed species.

The revised scope and changes to the project do not impact any extraordinary circumstances. EPA has also determined that the proposed changes do not alter the environmental impacts of the project. The action still qualifies under the CATEX issued on April 27, 2020.
