Communities with potential environmental justice concern are present in five block groups, which are located in phase 1B of the project.

The Project is expected to result in an overall benefit to the community by reducing the risk for property damage from potential system failures and creating a more reliable and resilient wastewater system, which will result in fewer disruptions to the community. Temporary impacts associated with project construction activities, such as construction noise, vehicle emissions, construction-related erosion, or traffic impacts, are not anticipated to disproportionately affect potential environmental justice communities with the implementation of standard construction best management practices, such as dust and traffic control measures.

EPA prepared the official endangered species list using IPaC on May 19th, 2021, for the Pipe Realignment and Meter Installation Project, which identified 10 threatened or endangered species with the potential to occur in the project area; no critical habitats were identified within the project area. EPA evaluated each species and determined that the project would have no effect on listed species.

EPA conducted historic properties record search for the project area using the California Historic Resources Information System (CHRIS). Of the CHRIS identified recorded resources within the searched project area, no sites were determined to be within the area of potential effects. EPA requested a Sacred Land File and Native American Contact List from the California Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) on July 7, 2021. NAHC responded on July 26, 2021, stating that the SLF search did identify Native American cultural resources within the project vicinity; the NAHC provided EPA with tribal contact information. EPA invited each party to participate and provide input in the Section 106 process. This coordination resulted in EPA becoming aware of tribal archaeological sites that overlap with portions of the project area. The United Auburn Indian Community of the Auburn Rancheria (UAIC) recommended requiring tribal monitoring present during excavations in areas identified to potentially contain a subsurface/buried cultural site. A tribal monitor has been coordinated with the borrower and tribe.

On September 24, 2021, EPA initiated consultation with the California State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), and consultation was reinitiated on October 26, 2021, with the additional recommendations provided by the tribe and a determination of no historic properties adversely affected. On November 24, 2021, SHPO provided some comments and requested additional information. The consultation process will not be concluded in time for scheduled loan close on December 8, 2021; therefore, EPA has coordinated with CA SHPO on the use of a condition precedent to disbursement related to NHPA. SHPO did not object and deferred to EPA's interpretation. Based on the records search and tribal coordination conducted to date, the action is not known or expected to significantly affect historic or cultural resources.

Some areas of the project within Phase 1b are within a 100-year floodplain; however, the new water infrastructure will be placed underground thereby not impeding or redirecting flood flows or affecting the existing levee system.

The project will not affect Bald and Golden Eagles, surface waters, marine mammals, wetlands, sole source aquifers, farmlands, coastal zones, coastal barriers, wild and scenic rivers, essential fish habitat, migratory birds, air quality or wilderness areas.

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
